The now more than 18,000 MIGH graduates have attended one or more of the courses we offer. They learned or strengthened their workforce skills to qualify for better paying jobs in the today's marketplace of today. Some of them are now capable to more efficiently manage their own small businesses.

Computer literacy is an essential knowledge to have in today's world, for family matters, and for work/

business purposes. Most of the new jobs in our region, in almost any industry, even in manufacturing, require practical knowledge in using a computer. A person is expected to perform the responsibilities of a modern office and even to actually operate cuttingedge machinery in different factories or distribution centers, as well as in retail and other businesses.

INVITATION BY MR. **JOSEPH DECKER JR., DIRECTOR OF THE UH-SBDC** OFFICE IN ROSENBEG, TX

Dear reader of the MIGH newsletter. I am very pleased to write this short piece inviting you and through you to all those people you know to make the important decision to improve your workforce skills by taking MIGH courses focused on Basic Computer Literacy.

MIGH has graduated more than 18,000 people to prosper in life and uses its own Educational Platform designed to teach adults how to work with efficiency. Many people are now practical computer users for at home applications and/or at the workplace. It is very important that more persons in the general Houston Metropolitan area learn and/or solidify their knowledge of the widely used software in business so that they can improve their abilities to run their business. Having the Basic Computer Technology skills that MIGH teaches increases your chances to succeed in your entrepreneurial purpose.

For 20 years I have been involved in the important work of assisting entrepreneurs to strengthen their abilities and processes to grow their businesses. Some of them have attended MIGH second level courses and have also recommended their employees to develop the Basic Computer Literacy skills to become more efficient at work.

A person can easily learn from MIGH instructors and online tutors how to navigate the internet, manage files stored in the computer, how to combine documents, how to communicate with vendors and clients, how to prepare a resume, an estimate, a letter, a proposal, an invoice, how to keep control of accounts payables and receivables using Excel, how to keep updated a database of clients with practical information such as e-mail address, office telephone numbers, cellular number, etc.

If you already know the Basics you can benefit by attending the Second Level courses MIGH offers such as Word. Excel and PowerPoint, which are excellent tools to develop a sales presentation, to prepare and send a marketing letter, to control costs, etc. At **UH-SBDC** Rosenberg office we know how much easier it is for an entrepreneur to prepare a Business Plan or to develop a Marketing Strategy document when they can work with a computer.

MIGH students receive a Student Manual and USB with information, and there are classes in English, in addition to the classes being taught in Spanish but all the material learned (software) is in English.

Today's digital working world is very demanding and those who do not have the Basic Skills in using a computer with efficiency are at a disadvantage. For 17 years MIGH has been successfully teaching computer technology at the Basic and the Second Level. Those who already know how to work with a computer can certainly benefit from attending the second level courses in order to develop a thorough and stronger ability to work faster and with accuracy. That helps the person find better paying jobs and/or to better manage her/his own small business.

As **MIGH** continues its valuable educational mission for minorities and others, our region becomes better equipped to attract investors willing to start a new business in our area.

One of the distinctive elements in the process is that in addition to the in the classroom instructor, MIGH students have the support of MIGH online tutors who provide feedback to each student about their learning process evidenced by their hands-on practice when

completing the required activities. A student may be advised by the online tutor to go back and review a specific chapter in order to repeat an activity which will help her/him solidify the learning process. It may be that the command of a technique or procedure can certainly be improved by the student.

During the Basic Course (100 classroom hours) the adult student also learn how to navigate the internet, how to use the Microsoft Office programs, the importance of keeping their children or grandchildren going to school and aspiring to attain a higher level education, things related to health, nutrition, how to avoid domestic violence and other very important topics like preparing a sales focused PowerPoint or a personal résumé. If a person does not have the minimal employer expected computer skills she/he will probably not be hired for a good paying position.

At the **UH-SBDC** Rosenberg office we find it advantageous that an existing entrepreneur or somebody who is seriously thinking about starting one is already capable to use a computer in her/ his business for business purposes.

Some companies could consider offering through MIGH Basic Computer Literacy or II Level courses in Excel, PowerPoint or Word to their employees or at the very least would be very happy to see members of their staff learning those new skills.

With the advancement of technology in the workplace there will be more opportunities for those who take the time and make the effort to invest in themselves improving their workforce skills. They will be paid more and job security will be higher for them. At the **UH-SBDC** we certainly see that small businesses with a staff that knows how to use the basic business software have more chances to succeed than otherwise. On this edition you can find information about the upcoming courses at MIGH.

As business advisors we are we see that the curriculum developed by MIGH is practical, taught in Spanish or English, depending on the group composition, affordable, interesting, and in about six months the student will be ready for success.

Each class is composed by a maximum of 30 students and usually the majority of them are women. MIGH staff also derives a deep sense of "mission accomplished" with each graduation ceremony, generally attended by almost all of the members of the family of each one of the graduates.

Learning Basic Computer Skills gives a person the inspiration to continue investing in their own education while becoming a good role model for their children and/or grandchildren. We are frequently being invited by MIGH to visit with their students encouraging them to consider opening a business and to assure them they can count with the UH-SBDC assistance.

All Cartas Poder (Power of Attorney) need the "Apostille". This procedure legally validates the document prepared by our Public Notary before the Texas Secretary of State.

Without the "Apostille" your documents will not be considered



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
